Differentiating Instruction

Part 1 Instructionally Responsive Classroom

This course supports teachers in establishing classrooms that are responsive to the varied Readiness levels, learning profiles, and interests of their students. Key principles and instructional strategies for differentiating the core curriculum will be presented. This course also provides participants with models to develop curriculum appropriate for special populations, such as English Learners and students identified as gifted and talented.

Part 2 Application to the Core (Prerequisite: Part 1 and a working knowledge of the theory and strategies behind differentiation.) This session offers individuals or teams an opportunity to apply the concepts of differentiation to their core curricula.
